**Khudjakov, Yu. S. Russian Soldiers Defending the Southern Boundaries of Western Siberia in the End of the XVI – the First of the XVII Centuries: Part 1.**

The author analyzes the level of military art development among the Russian soldiers and Siberian Tatars as well as the role of military factor in defending the southern boundaries of Western Siberia from Turkic and Mongolian nomads in the end of the XVI - first third of the XVII centuries when there was a real possibility of the Siberian Khanate's restoration.

**Semyonov O.V. Managers of the Western Siberian yams (relay stations) in the XVII century.**

**Vedernikov, V.V. The Nerchinsk Plants Before the Period of the Imperial Cabinet's Direct Control over the Nerchinsk Mining Administration (1704–1787).**

The article deals with analysis of the reasons underlying the crisis in the Nerchinsk Mining District which led to liquidation of the silver-refining industry in Eastern Siberia. Based on the archival materials the author proves that the "pre-Cabinet" era paved way for the future crisis of the Nerchinsk plants.

**Verkhoturova, T.G. The Yeniseisk provincial administration size and structure in 1822–1917.**

This article considers the authorized and real staff size of the Yeniseisk provincial administration in 1822–1917. Based on the previously unknown documents and archival materials the author considers peculiarities of the Yeniseisk government administration, the

actual and relative number of officials holding the higher ranks of field and non-commissioned officers. The author also describes trends of the Yeniseisk administration development and shows how its size changed over time.

**Sheremetyeva, D.L. Siberian Newspapers during the Period of "Democratic Counterrevolution" (in the End of May – the Middle of November 1918).**

The article deals with newspapers published in the end of May – the middle of November 1918 in Siberia under the rule of the anti-Bolshevik government. The author studies the circumstances under which the newspapers were published, shows changes in quantity and contents of the local press. It is stated that liquidation of the Soviet power in Siberia led to reestablishment of the freedom of speech and radical changes in the sphere of periodical press. Newspapers as a social institute preserved their independence from the authorities despite the escalation of Civil War and evolution of the political regime of "democratic counter-revolution" towards authoritarianism.

**Antonov, E.P. Discussions on the Prospects of the Yakut National Intelligentsia Development in the 1920s (by the Example of the «Sakha Omuk» Society).**

society members and the Party-Soviet organs in which they put forward the questions of interrelations between the power and intelligentsia; activities of national associations in the period of NEP, et al.

**Trotsenko, N.D. Twenty-five-thousanders in Western Siberia: Carrying Out the Social and Mobilizing Functions (1930–1931).**

The article written on the paperwork and documents of the Communist party bodies analyzes activities of the twenty-five-thousanders – the workers, who were sent to the Siberian region from industrial centers for conducting the forced collectivization. The author reveals positive and negative factors that affected these workers' adaptation to the new social functions and comes to conclusion that about one fourth of all mobilized workers could not manage their task.

**Isaev, V.D., Mikheev, D.Yu. Lawfulness in Stalin's State: Resolution of TsIK and Sovnarkom (SNK) dated 7 August 1932 and Its Fulfillment in Western Siberia.**

The article deals with legal collisions driven by the notorious "law of spikelets" passed in 1932. The author shows the scale of repressions connected with execution of this law in Western Siberia; explains reasons of its gradual exclusion from legal practice.

**Ablazhey, N.N. Deportation of Armenian Population into the Altai Territory in the 1940s.**

The paper is devoted to the deportation of Armenian population from the southern regions of the Soviet Union to the Altai territory in 1949. For the first time in historiography the author clarifies the numbers of this particular category of forced migrants, as well as the structure of their settlement and local authorities' activities providing adaptation and distribution of the migrants within the region. The paper is written on the basis of new data from the declassified documents kept in the State Archives of the Altai Region.

**Gorbachev, O.V. Small Towns and Rural Area: Regional Patterns of Demographic Evolution in the Second Half of XX Century.**

The article's purpose is to examine the prospects of demographic development in rural areas near small towns in the context of Russia's urbanization. The urgency of the problem is determined both by the consequences of the rural area's active depopulation in the second half of the XX century and by the necessity to clarify the role of small towns in the urbanization process. The author considers main types of the Russian small towns and analyzes the specific features of their formation and functioning. He also defines different types of demographic modernization of rural areas adjacent to small towns. The author concludes that the most natural model of demographic modernization of rural area is offered by small satellite towns located near metropolitan agglomerations.

**Dmitrienko, K.V. Scientific Heritage of A.I. Levshin as a Source for Studying the Nomad Civilization of the Kazakhs.**

The present article deals with a fundamental work of A.I. Levshin «Description of Kirghiz-Cossack or Kirghiz-Kaisatsk hordes and steppes», published in 1832. The work is often cited by the researchers so it proves the book's relevance and importance for studying history and culture of Kazakhstan. Its author presents different archival materials, the results of his field surveys, gives a detailed geographical description of Kazakhstan. For the first time in historiography he referred to the issues of the Kazakhs ethnogeny, their material and spiritual culture. Levshin's book has been an important source of data on politics, economy, culture and family life of the Kazakhs.

**Kulikovskih, S.N. "On behalf of Zlatoust factories workers..." Manufacturing of Reward and Gift Axes in 1920–1930.**

The aim of publication is to study the history of ornamented items production in the 1920s–1930s at the Zlatoust factory. Problems of industrial culture are analyzed on the basis of the interdisciplinary approach which allows studying the history of Zlatoust artistic metal production – a special sphere of the Urals metallurgical production, an original phenomenon, which appeared as an alloy of science, production process, craft and art. Being the artifact of industrial heritage it also belongs to the field of art. The research is based on facts and events supported with documentary witnesses and archival sources, which were published for the first time.

**Chernolutskaya, E.N. "The Kulaks of Special Destination" in the Soviet Far East (early 1930s).**

The article is devoted to one of the groups of "special deportees" which appeared in the Stalinist state and consisted of the frontiersmen of Belorussia and Ukraine. These groups were deported to the Far East in transit through Siberia. The author shows distinction between these deportees and the majority of "exiled kulaks"; reveals the specific character of interregional relationships between different OGPU bodies being in charge of resettlement. The author investigated the reasons of temporary separate resettlement of family heads (in Yakutia) and other family members (in DVK), describes a painful process of their reunification, their living conditions in special settlements and their labor in the areas of gold mines.

**Shelegina, O.N. Representation and Analysis of the Activities of the SB RAS Museums in the Almanac “Museums of the Russian Academy of Sciences”.**

For the first time in historiography the author analyzed how the museums of the SB RAS and their activities were represented in a specialized periodical Almanac «Museums of the Russian Academy of Sciences”. She highlighted several groups of articles based on their contents – museographical, analytical, topical and doctrinal articles. It

was established that active publication of materials contributed to determining the role and significance of Siberian museums in the system of science museums, reflecting their role in the process of formation of scientific collections and translation of scientific knowledge about the Siberian region. It also provided realization of their adaptive capacity and integration into the Russian museum community.
