EXTRACTS FROM THE RULES.

Members residing in London are entitled to take out ten volumes at a time. Residents in the Country fifteen.

II

No Member to be allowed more than one new English work at a time, except on additional subscription.

III.

Carriage and all other expenses incurred from the time of issuing the book to the time of its return to the Library, must be paid by the Members.

IV.

Fourteen days are allowed for the perusal of new books (books published within the last twelve months), and two months for books of older date.

V.

If application is made to the Librarian for any book that has been out (according to its class) fourteen days or two months, it must be returned immediately, and no more books can be issued to the Subscriber until its return. No book is to be kept out longer than three months without a renewal of the entry in the Librarian's Register.

N.B.—Prompt attention to the Librarian's application for the return of books is earnestly requested, and the early return of books, in all cases, without notice from the Librarian will greatly promote the usefulness of the Library.

It is hardly necessary to add that it is a serious infringement of the Rules of the Society to make pencil or other marks in the books of the Library.

Subscribers are admitted on the recommendation of a Member, subject to the approval of the Committee.
