

ASSEMBLED

At their MICHAELMAS General Quarter-Sessions,  
 held at Gloucester, on the 2d Day of November  
 in the Year of our Lord 1789.

Mr. CHAIRMAN,

As an apology for engaging so much of the  
 attention of this Court, as I am about to  
 do, I must claim your recollection of the proceed-  
 ings of the last sessions, relative to the subject under  
 our present consideration.

You may remember, Sir, that I had then the  
 honour to report to the Bench, from the Com-  
 missioners for building the Gaol and Houses of  
 Correction—"That in consequence of the ad-  
 vanced state of the building under their care,  
 it appeared to them proper to remind the Ma-  
 gistrates of the necessity of their proceeding to  
 frame Bye-Laws and Regulations for their po-  
 lice; and to consider of an effective appoint-  
 ment of officers for their government."—The  
 business having been immediately entered upon,
