### Nurses Shortage Growing

According to statistics provided by Tatiana Semyonova, Director of Medical Training and HR Department of the Russian Ministry of Health, the country's outpatient care facilities experience a shortage of nurses estimated at more than 130,000 and growing. The average staffing ratio of 25 patients per one nurse is five times the WHO standard.
