A NEW form of cruelty consists of overtaking the strength of dogs when running w bicycles over long distances at high speed. Some dogs would rather die than st when following their masters, and this has actually happened without the knowledge the time of their owners; who, nevertheless, cannot be acquitted of blame for leavi their faithful companions behind, especially after they have seen even a least sign of th distress. It has come to the knowledge of the Society that hundreds of dogs have be lost in country places, consequent on bicycle-riders out-running them on roads where trace of the course they have taken has been left. In such instances the poor anim have become strays, with no hope of rescue and no means of subsistence. Caution has been issued to bicyclists to leave their dogs at home, or keep them within sight during th perambulations.

Upon this Institution, founded in 1824 (the only one having for its object the prot tion of dumb and defenceless animals), rests a heavy responsibility. It is earnestly a respectfully submitted that it has in consequence a strong claim upon the benevolence the humane and charitable.

The Committee respectfully appeal to the Public to extend a hearty assistance—

- I. By supplying early information to the Secretary of all acts of cruelty that ha been witnessed.
- II. By increasing the revenue of the Society by annual subscriptions, by donati^{on} by testamentary gifts, and particularly by inducing their friends to beco^{me} members.

Trained Officers are despatched to all parts of the kingdom. 7,320 convict obtained during 1896.

The increased operations of the Society have drawn from the funds an amount w exceeding the yearly subscriptions. The Committee need much greater assistance, a unless such additional support be extended to them, this most righteous cause ^{of} humanity must suffer from insufficiency of means to carry out those many urgent measu^{re} which every well-wisher of this Society has so deeply at heart. THIS HOME was instituted in 1860, to clear the London Streets of Lost and Starving Dogs, to shelter and feed them, to restore lost dogs to their owners, to find suitable homes for the unclaimed at nominal charges, to destroy dangerous and worthless dogs in a painless manner, and to cremate them; thus avoiding what might be an unsanitary nuisance if they were otherwise disposed of.

During 1896, no less than 42,614 Dogs were received.

230,000 Dogs have been received during the past 10 years.

SCHEME FOR EXTENSION.

Owing to the great pressure upon the space available at Battersea, and the impossibility of increasing the accommodation for the dogs there, the Committee have decided to extend the usefulness of the Home, by establishing premises a short distance in the country, whither the better class of dogs may be sent after their five days' compulsory confinement, so as to improve their condition and give them a better chance of life. In such a place, the Dogs would not only enjoy life better than at Battersea, but they would receive better individual attention, as well as be admitted to daily exercise over grass, which, besides being so necessary for their well-being, all dogs love so much.
