THE object of this Handbook is to present to Travellers, in a portable form, a concise and practical Guide to Norway of easy reference.

The work is based on actual travels through the country, and on personal knowledge of the places described. The present Edition, like the last, has been subjected to a searching revision ; notices have been inserted of the Railways hitherto opened, and though, from the constant changes resulting from the peculiar system of posting in Norway, absolute accuracy is unattainable, it is hoped that the volume will be found a tolerably complete practical Guide.
