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PREFACE.

THE Author has been pondering over this subject of our direct Railway communication with our Indian Empire at various intervals, since Mr. W. P. Andrew's Book on the Euphrates Valley Route appeared in 1857. The only conclusion that can be safely arrived at is that the British nation must construct, at its own cost, the proposed line of railway from Scutari to Kurrachee, connecting it with the continental system at Constantinople, by a tunnel under the Bosphorous, or by steamers capable of conveying an entire train across
