EDITOR'S PREFACE.

THE time has now come when the Autobiography, carefully revised and finally adjusted, must be issued in a POPULAR and STANDARD EDITION. The Public hailed it from the first with a welcome so uncommon, and God has in many ways so signally owned and blessed it, that it would be no modesty, but sheer stupidity, on my part, to fail in recognising that it has been voted a Missionary Classic by the great and free Community of Readers. I have therefore spared no pains in making it as perfect as it is in my power to do, with the help of many minute corrections from friends here and abroad, and also happy suggestions as to matters of detail from the honoured Missionary himself.

The somewhat voluminous TABLE OF CONTENTS, originally given, has been withdrawn from the beginning of the book—though still found in sections at the head of each separate chapter—and, instead thereof, a full and much more serviceable INDEX has been added at the close. Subjects, of great importance to a right understanding of many questions touched upon in the book itself, but impossible to be woven into the same without obstructing the flow of the narrative, have been thrown into a six-fold APPENDIX. And, finally, the chapter in Part Second, formerly entitled *Letters from Aniwa*, has been entirely omitted, partly from exigencies of space, and partly from the hope that the authoress
